

# Call for applications for the renewal of the Editor-in-Chief of the review FINANCE

## Presentation

Finance is the review of the French Finance Association (AFFI). It is an academic review which publishes scientific papers related to Finance in English. It features in the rankings (ABDC, ABS, Scopus)

It aims at covering all aspects of finance with financial economics, financial management, corporate finance, quantitative finance, financial econometrics, mathematical finance, international finance, banking finance, behavioral finance, entrepreneurial finance (and so) in mind. The list of interesting subjects is extremely large: Asset Pricing, Corporate Governance, Financial Markets, Financial Institutions and Banking (management, intermediation and regulation), Risk Management, Financial Distress and Bankruptcy, Ethics and Sustainability, Derivatives, Insurance, Macrofinance, Market Microstructure, Portfolio & Asset Management, Private Equity, Real Estate Finance, etc.

A call for candidates, with effect from the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024, has been launched to renew the role of editor-in-chief, which until then had been held by Carole Bernard.

## Governance of the review

The governance of the review is ensured by

- The Editor-in-Chief. He (or she) is an academic or a leading figure in Finance. He or she will be responsible for maintaining relations with the FNEGE, the CNRS and other academic organizations. He or she may chair an annual conference organized jointly with the French Finance Association. The purpose of this annual conference is to publicize the journal, obtain additional manuscripts and, as far as possible, provide resources for publishing the journal.
- Two co-editors
  - o Nihat AKTAS (WHU Otto Beisheim School of Management) Co-editor
  - o Christophe GODLEWSKI (University of Strasbourg) Co-editor

The Editor in chief is appointed for a renewable term of 3 years. The next term will run from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2024 to 1<sup>st</sup> March 2027.

## Nomination Committee

There is a Nomination Committee. It is responsible for evaluating the most suitable candidates for the position of Editor-in-Chief of Finance. It is made up of 6 people who have agreed to take part: the outgoing Editor-in-Chief, the two co-editors, two members of the Editorial Board, the President of the AFFI.

The Committee members may not stand for election.

The candidates shall send to the Nomination Committee:

- a letter of application,
- a project with a strategy and development plan for the review,
- a Curriculum Vitae.

The Nomination Committee meets for the first time to examine the applications and invite the candidates to clarify certain points, if needed.

1<sup>st</sup> January 2024: Publication of the call for applications on the websites and social networks close to Finance.
