Ph.D. Position in Behavioral finance and Financial economics at the University of Orléans

We invite applications for a PhD position. The position is available from October 1, 2021 for a period of three years.

The future PhD student is expected to write a dissertation on a topic related to personal finances, savings choices, and personal management of financial risks. The student will be supervised by Sylvain Benoit (Dauphine University), Béatrice Boulu-Reshef (University of Orléans) and Alexis Direr (University of Orléans). She/he will be affiliated with the LEO (http://www.leo-univ-orleans.fr/fr/) that has an excellent national and international PhD student placement history. The fellowship amounts to 1,400 euros per month, after tax (without taking into account possible course load)

The PhD is part of a greater research project conducted with fintech companies. The general objective of the project is to produce quality and original research on financial risks, their perception by savers, the resulting risk management errors. The PhD is expected to account for the existence of behavioral biases in financial choices. Behavioral finance studies and their applications respond to the problems encountered by the financial industry in terms of the most appropriate ways to assist individuals in their savings and investment choices.

Applicants are expected to have completed (or being close to completing) a Master's degree in economics. Good skills in microeconomics, behavioral economics, econometrics and financial economics are required. There is no mandatory teaching. Proficiency in English and French is necessary. Presentation of the research results at scientific conferences and participation in the publication of results in leading journals are expected.
